REVISION TIPS:

- Revision sessions should be for 6 days (student to choose which day they would prefer off as a reward).
- Select a subject for each session and fill in the table.
- Revise for **45 min – 60 min** per session.
- Revise **flashcards** – 5 min every day.
- Use **past papers**, mark them and make a note of weak topics. **Practice** those topics separately and make flashcards on them.
- Writing notes is a passive learning technique and NOT very effective.
- **Instead use active learning techniques like flashcards, mind maps and even teach someone (even a teddy bear).** Use the senses to actively support your learning (I speak, I listen to myself, I write, I see what I write).
- **In the breaks between sessions, get outside into nature or do something physical. Don't just sit and play a video game or watch something on social media.**
- If you want music in the background, then put on classical music e.g. **Mozart**, otherwise work in **silence**. (Pop/rock/grime/EDM/hip hop/rap etc. does not help the brain to study effectively).
- Sit at a **desk** with a **good light**. Lying on the bed isn't a good posture for serious work.
